Burglary convictions

James Beharry, 28, of Brentford and Basil Heath, 28, of Hayes were sentenced in June after pleading guilty to a combined eleven offences. Five of these offences related to residential burglaries in Hayes, Harrow and Ealing. Using a brick to smash windows, the pair stole jewellery, and laptops and on one occasion committed the offence whilst the victims were asleep upstairs.

The pair were caught when the investigating officers from our Proactive CID Unit pieced together a large amount of CCTV footage from local council cameras, retail premises and doorbell videos allowing them to track the journeys of the men at the time of the offences and sometimes leading back to their home addresses.

James Beharry pleaded guilty to five counts of burglary, one for possession of cannabis, one for breach of a community order and one breach of a suspended sentence. He was sentenced to four years and nine months imprisonment. Basil Heath pleaded guilty to two residential burglary charges, one for possession of cannabis and two driving offences. He received a thirty month imprisonment sentence.

This was a prolific burglary team and, since their incarceration, West Area has seen a noticeable reduction in burglary offences.
