The brief summary of Borough **crime figures** for the year April 2012 to March 2013 given in the June Newsletter is expanded as follows:

- Total crime has decreased by 13.7% to 20616 offences
- Residential Burglary offences are lower at 2200 offences, representing a decrease of 18.4%. Burglary detections have increased from 6.7% to 10.3%
- Theft of motor vehicle offences are down by 18.6% to 522 offences
- Theft from motor vehicle offences are down by 23.1% to 2148 offences
- Personal Robbery has decreased by 14.9%
- Youth Violence is down by 19.6% and serious youth violence down by 26.7%
- Offences of most serious violence are down by 17.7%
- Gun crime figures have decreased by 5.2%, which equates to a reduction of 3 crimes
- Racial & religious crimes have decreased by 10.9% with a detection rate of 43.6%
- Homophobic crime has decreased from 27 to 20 crimes

The MPS are currently running **Project Killdeer** which aims to raise awareness concerning illegal street collectors, and attempts to ensure that charitable contributions reach the causes that they are intended for. It is estimated that £147 million is lost to charities through fraud each year.

Quick and simple points to note when you next contribute to a charity street collection:

All charity collection buckets or tins MUST:

- Display the name of the charity on the bucket or tin.
- Be securely sealed.

The collector must be in possession of written authority from the charity and also a permit issued by the MPS.

If they do not have a permit they commit an offence.

There are only certain days of the month that collections are allowed to take place and each charity is only allowed to collect once per year in any given local authority area. Therefore, if you see the same person collecting for the same charity more than once a month, they probably have not got a permit.

N.B. Train stations are subject to different legislation and hence the above does not apply

Details of current permits issued by the MPS Charities office are published on the MPS website ([www.met.police.uk/charities](http://www.met.police.uk/charities)).

This website also covers other types of charitable collections.

In most cases the charities will be registered. This can be checked on the charity commission website ([www.charitycommission.gov.uk](http://www.charitycommission.gov.uk)).

Should you feel that a charity street collector is committing an offence please contact your local policing team.
