Inspector David George (North) told an IRA meeting on 24th October of the reduction in crime in the Borough; Burglary(23%), Robbery (34%), Vehicle crime(20%) and Overall Crime(24%) were all significantly down. This is in spite of being significantly undermanned. He praised the co-operation he is receiving from the residents including HRAC.

Chief Inspector Rob Wilson (Borough) also passed on the Borough good news on crime reduction and told of 19 arrests following Operation Big Wing* which were mainly for Class A drug offences. He also reminds everyone to leave lights on and make sure your property is well secured as the nights draw in.

Inspector Andy Lewis (East) said "This* was an outstanding day of Partnership action with Met officers and Council enforcement Officers working together for a safer Hillingdon
